WHEREAS: Water Quality Awareness Week is being sponsored by the Central States Water Pollution Control Association, an organization comprised of 1,278 members involved in the proper treatment and disposal of municipal and industrial wastewaters in Minnesota, Wisconsin, and Illinois; and

Water Quality Awareness Week will focus attention on the role local wastewater WHEREAS: treatment plants play in protecting our water resources; and

Water Quality Awareness Week provides a time for the citizens of our state to learn WHEREAS: more about Wastewater treatment plant and what staff at these facilities do to protect the valuable water resources of the state;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim October 22 through October 28, 1989 to be
