

Proclamation

WHEREAS: The Cities of Mankato and North Mankato are widely known for being progressive, and having a sphere of influence that extends far beyond the boundaries of Southern Minnesota; and

The Cities of Mankato and North Mankato are recognized as, and will continue to develop as a hub of commerce, education, religion, health care, government, recreation, and culture; and

WHEREAS: The driving force behind the advantages and attractions listed above is the willingness of the people of the community to do whatever is possible to make their area the best place in which to live, work, and play; and

WHEREAS: The ACT 2000 Strategic Planning Process, citizen involvement in making "Capital for a Day" a success, and the daily work of volunteer and service organizations too numerous to name, typifies the generous spirit of the Mankato/North Mankato community; and
