



Proclamation

- WHEREAS: Franklin Hobbs was born in St. Paul on November 17, 1919, and graduated from Minneapolis Edison High School; and
- WHEREAS: During high school he sang with bands, and this led to his move to California before he was 25; and
- WHEREAS: During World War II, Franklin joined the Army Air Corps, flying B-24 bombing runs in the China, Burma, and India Theatre of Operations; and
- WHEREAS: After the war, he worked as a radio director for General Artists Corporation with Bing Crosby, Perry Como, and Peggy Lee, among others; and
- WHEREAS: Franklin then moved to New York City, and began working for a talent production company as creative director; and
- WHEREAS: Franklin's achievements include doing a stint as an announcer on the Fanny Brice Show, and acting on the Lux Theatre; and
- WHEREAS: In 1959, he joined WCCO Radio in the Twin Cities, and for years his mellifluous voice was heard in the middle of the night on "Hobbs House;" and
- WHEREAS: Franklin began working at KLBB 1400 Radio in 1983, and he's still going strong with the best of the big bands and ballads;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Friday, November 17, 1989 to be
