

## Proclamation

- WHEREAS: Al Whitman is a member of the Minneapolis Park and Recreation Board; and
- WHEREAS: During the past several years the Park Board has undertaken a number of major development projects including: the creation of park lands and the Great River Road along the Central Mississippi Riverfront; development of a concert site on Nicollet Island; construction of Boom Island Park; construction of the new 1,400 seat Minneapolis Ice Garden; and the creation of the Minneapolis Sculpture Garden, a joint project with the Walker Art Center; and
- WHEREAS: Neighborhood and community parks and recreation services continue to be improved with a long-range plan of priorities, as well as development of new parks; and
- WHEREAS: The Park Board has continued to provide a series of new youth initiatives including Recreation Plus, an after-school child care program; a Teens Care Program for older youths; staffed recreational programs at 11 playgrounds; and Teen Teamworks, a summer employment program for "at risk" youth; and
- WHEREAS: The Minneapolis Park and Recreation Board was named the winner of the 1989 National Gold Medal Award, Monday, October 23, 1989 at the National Recreation and Park Association (NRPA) Congress in San Antonio, Texas;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Thursday, November 26, 1989 to be

MINNEAPOLIS PARK AND RECREATION BOARD DAY


in Minnesota.
