<u>PROCLAMATION</u>.

On June 14, 1777, Congress adopted the Stars and Stripes as the official flag of the United States of America. Beneath this banner thousands of patriots have since marched in sanction and support of American ideals.

In remembrance of the principles our flag symbolizes, I, Theodore Christianson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby designate

THURSDAY, JUNE 14, 1928, as FLAG DAY and do earnestly request that the flag of our country be displayed from public buildings, places of business and homes; that school children, wherever schools are in session, be instructed not only in the approved ways of displaying the flag and showing proper respect therefor, but in the ideals of liberty and the principles of government which it exemplifies; and that the people generally, in their respective communities, give thought to commemoration and observance of the one hundred fifty-first anniversary of the adoption of the Flag of the United States and to dedicate themselves anew to the ideals, traditions and institutions for which it stands.



In Witness Whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be hereto affixed at the Cafitol in the City of St. Paul, this 7/th day of June, A. D. 1928.
