WHEREAS: On Sunday, January 21, 1990 the Richfield Human Rights Commission and the Richfield Ministerial Association are cosponsoring the All Richfield Ethnic Celebration at House of Prayer Church in Richfield; and

WHEREAS: This event will include a multi-cultural program, exhibits, and ethnic food; and

WHEREAS: The program features Jackie Pflug, a victim of terrorism in 1985 while flying from Athens, Greece to Cairo, Egypt; and

WHEREAS: Jackie now speaks full-time to businesses, organizations, churches, and schools, telling her story of the hijacking, her survival, and her strength and coping skills; her message at this event will focus on Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s dream of brotherhood; and

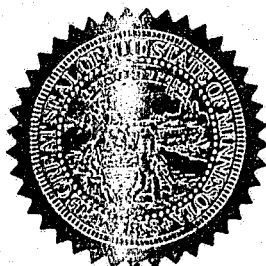
