



Proclamation

- WHEREAS:** On January 22, 1918, a free and independent Ukrainian National Republic was proclaimed by the will of the Ukrainian people represented by the legally elected Ukrainian Parliament in Kiev, ancient capital of Ukraine, which Republic was recognized by a score of foreign nations; and
- WHEREAS:** After such Declaration of Independence and recognition, Ukraine was occupied by Russian military forces and since that time the former citizens of the Ukrainian National Republic have been living under the oppressive rule of Communist Russia, being denied the basic freedoms which linger in their hearts; and
- WHEREAS:** Their continuing struggle for freedom and independence is typical of the struggle of all freed living peoples everywhere and strongly emphasizes for us -- free Americans -- at home and abroad, and especially against Communist aggression which seriously threatens the peace and security of the peoples of the world; and
- WHEREAS:** Americans have a traditional interest in the defense of freedom and human rights and sympathize with the aspirations of freedom-loving people wherever freedom is denied; and
- WHEREAS:** Minnesotans of Ukrainian descent annually observe the anniversary of the Ukrainian Declaration of Independence on January 22;
- NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Monday, January 22, 1990 to be**

UKRAINIAN INDEPENDENCE DAY

in Minnesota.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this eighth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and ninety, and of the State the one hundred thirty-first.
