



Proclamation

WHEREAS: Minnesotans generate approximately four million tons of solid waste every year; and

WHEREAS: Much of the solid waste generated in Minnesota can be recycled; and

WHEREAS: For true recycling to occur, recyclable materials must be collected, remanufactured into new products, and then sold to consumers for reuse; and

WHEREAS: To provide state leadership in waste reduction and recycling programs, state agencies are mandated by Executive Order No. 88-11 and the Waste Reduction and Recycling Act of 1989 to recycle, and when possible, to purchase recycled materials; and

WHEREAS: On March 30, 1990, the Department of Administration and the Office of Waste Management will co-sponsor a "Buy Recycled Products Workshop," which will bring together vendors of recycled products, public and private sector purchasers, educators, and other interested individuals to learn more about recycled products, their availability, and how to purchase them;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Friday, March 30, 1990 to be

BUY RECYCLED DAY

in Minnesota in honor of our state's efforts to reduce, reuse, and recycle.
