- WHEREAS: White Bear Lake has been widely known as a brilliant, picturesque and warmhearted city for over 120 years, receiving early commendation in the writings of Mark Twain; and
- WHEREAS: The attraction of White Bear Lake began as a freestanding city, marketplace and resort community, and although it is now a leading suburb of the Twin Cities, it retains its friendly small town atmosphere; and
- WHEREAS: White Bear Lake has received numerous state and national awards and recognitions for its quality of life, citizen participation in its self government, environmental education, and leadership among communities; and
- WHEREAS: The success of White Bear Lake in achieving its high quality of life, protecting its environment and educating its residents is based on the hard work, dedication, and spirit of its citizens; and
- WHEREAS: The volunteer efforts of White Bear Lake citizens, through community based service organizations, churches, schools, municipal commissions, and individuals are at the heart of the community, but too numerous to name; and
- WHEREAS: White Bear Lake desires to continue to participate in and lead public policy in its community and in Minnesota, and its volunteer efforts deserve praise as an example for all Minnesotans;
