WHEREAS: April 22, 1990 marks the twentieth anniversary of the first Earth Day, when more than 20 million Americans joined together to demonstrate their concern for the environment; and

WHEREAS: Earth Day 1990 is a national and international event in which all citizens are invited to join in a global effort to save the planet, which despite some environmental improvements in the past 19 years, is increasingly endangered; and

WHEREAS: Earth Day 1990 activities in Minnesota, and across the nation and the world will help inform citizens on the importance of recycling, conserving energy and water, using efficient transportation, adopting more ecologically sound lifestyles, using products which are least harmful to the environment, doing business with environmentally responsible companies, and supporting environmental protection legislation; and

WHEREAS: Citizens of the State of Minnesota, young and old alike, can help make a difference in the effort to preserve our global environment, by participating in the Earth Day 1990 activities;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim April 22, 1990 to be
