With an unparalleled and unspoiled setting at the western-most point on Lake Superior WHEREAS: and the St. Lawrence Seaway, the city of Duluth is the regional service center for the residents of Northern Minnesota, Wisconsin, Michigan and Southern Ontario; and

WHEREAS: Duluth enhances and offers a broad and growing variety of services for its diverse population, including conventions, education, entertainment, finance, government, industry, law, media, medicine, recreation, retailing, tourism and transportation; and

WHEREAS: Because of its splendid natural and human assets, Duluth is the recipient of national awards and recognition for its exemplary leadership and quality of life in a wide variety of areas, ranging from the arts to domestic abuse intervention programs; and

WHEREAS: The unique qualities of Duluth and Duluthians result in significant and tangible improvements to their special way of life, which are well-represented by a state-of-the-art and world class paper mill, a state convention center, and waterfront enhancements:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim
