2 AN ORDINANCE TO CHANGE THE MUNICIPAL NAME OF THE VILLAGE OF
WEST MINNEAPOLIS TO THE VILLAGE OF HOPKINS.

3 The Village Council of the Village of West Minneapolis,
4 Hennepin County, Minnesota, do ordain as follows:

5 Section 1. That the municipal and incorporated name of the
6 Village of West Minneapolis be and is hereby changed to the cor-
7 porate and municipal name of the Village of Hopkins, Hennepin
8 County, Minnesota, to correspond with the name "Hopkins" of the
9 postoffice in such Village as designated by the United States
10 Postal Authorities, and also to correspond with the name "Hopkins"
11 designated as the name of the railroad stations in such Village.

12 Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full
13 force from and after its passage and publication, and upon the
14 filing of a certified copy of this ordinance with the County
15 Auditor of Hennepin County, Minnesota, and with the State Audi-
16 tor and the Secretary of State of Minnesota.
