WHEREAS: There will be 2,600 breast cancer cases in Minnesota during 1990; and

WHEREAS: The diagnosis of breast cancer has a profound impact on patients and their family members; and

WHEREAS: The Reach to Recovery program of the American Cancer Society is structured to help the patient deal with the physical, emotional, and cosmetic aspects of the disease and its treatment; and

WHEREAS: Reach to Recovery volunteers are women who have undergone breast cancer treatment and are now role models who offer tangible evidence that patients can recover, can adjust, and can resume their former lives and activities; and

WHEREAS: The American Cancer Society is celebrating the 20th anniversary of Reach to Recovery as one of its Service and Rehabilitation programs;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Saturday, May 5, 1990 to be

in Minnesota, in honor of the 20th anniversary of the program -- as a time of great celebration, renewed dedication, and continued hope for breast cancer patients.
