WHEREAS: Young people today have the enthusiasm and goodwill to extend the hand of fellowship to those in need; and

WHEREAS: We need to offer young people an opportunity to serve at every age level, from kindergarten through high school; through public and private youth agencies and organizations; in colleges and universities; and in full-time service corps for young adults; and

WHEREAS: Young people in over one hundred fifty exemplary programs are being recognized today for contributing valuable service to their communities; and

WHEREAS: These young people have demonstrated their capacity to learn about their communities and their role as citizens and have made a major positive impact upon the state;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim April 27, 1990 to be
