State of Minnesota.


Whereas, it has been represented to the  
Commissioner of Game and Fish that deer are in  
danger of undue depletion or becoming extinct in  
the Counties of Houston, Winona and Wabasha, and,


Whereas, the Commissioner of Game and Fish  
has investigated and has presented me with the  
result of his investigation and has recommended that  
protection be given deer in Houston, Winona and  
Wabasha Counties to prevent their undue depletion or  
extinction,

Now, Therefore, I, Theodore Christianson,  
Governor of the State of Minnesota, by virtue of and  
pursuant to authority in me vested by Section 5640  
G. S. 1923, do hereby order that no deer be taken in  
the Counties of Houston, Winona and Wabasha, State of  
Minnesota, during the season 1928.

This order shall remain in force until the  
close of the 1929 regular session of the legislature  
of the State of Minnesota unless sooner revoked or  
modified.
