STATE OF MINNESOTA EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT

Governor's Order #22 Extending Additional Protection to Bullheads in the State of Minnesota.

Whereas, it has been represented to the Commissioner of Game and Fish that bullheads are in danger of undue depletion in the waters of the State of Minnesota, and,

Whereas, the Commissioner of Game and Fish has investigated and has presented me with the results of his investigation and has recommended that additional protection be given to bullheads in the waters of the State of Minnesota to prevent their undue depletion,

Now, Therefore, I, Theodore Christianson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, by virtue of and pursuant to authority in me vested by Section 134, Chapter 400, S. L. 1919, (Section 5640 G. S. 1923), do hereby order that no bullheads be taken from the waters of Minnesota during the year 1928, in any manner for commercial purposes, or bought, sold, shipped or transported for such purposes except when deemed necessary and advisable by the Commissioner of Game and Fish when after investigation he finds that any of the conditions set forth in Section 5605 G. S. 1923 exist, when such bullheads may be fished for commercial purposes under the rules and regulations prescribed by the Commissioner of Game and Fish.

This order shall not effect the taking of bull-heads for commercial purposes under license in interstate or international waters, nor effect the taking of bullheads taken by operations conducted under and by virtue of any contract entered into by the Commissioner of Game and Fish, or under any license or permit issued by said commissioner under authority of law.

This order shall remain in force until the close of the 1929 regular session of the legislature of the State of Minnesota unless sooner revoked or modified.
