That the boundaries of the village of Cass Lake be and do extend as follows:

Section 1. That the following described unplatted lands, to-wit: the east half of the north east quarter (1/4 NE 1/4) of section sixteen (16), of township one hundred forty-five (145) north of range thirty-one (31) west of the fifth principal meridian abutting upon the incorporated village of Cass Lake, Minnesota, be and the same is hereby annexed to said village and the village boundaries of said village are hereby extended so as to include and make said lands a part of said village as effectually as if it had been originally a part thereof.

Section 2. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately after its passage, approval, publication, and the filing of a certified copy thereof with the Secretary of State.

Section 1. That the following described unplatted lands, namely the East half of the North east quarter (E $\frac{1}{2}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Sixteen (16) of Township One hundred forty five (145) North, of Range Thirty one (31) West of the fifth principal meridian abutting upon the incorporated village of Cass Lake, Minnesota, be and the same is hereby annexed to such village and the village boundaries of said village are hereby extended so as to include and make said lands a part of said village as effectually as if it had been originally a part thereof.

Section 2. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately after its passage, approval, publication, and the filing of a certified copy thereof with the Secretary of State.
