- 3. That at the time of said election there were residing in said territory not more than 100 citizens of the United States, and not more than 90 of such citizens of the United States who had theretofore been actual bona fide residents and citizens of the state of Minnesota for six months prior thereto, and not more than 90 who had been actual
