In response to your letter of March 20, 1929, regarding articles of incorporation of Ministers Pension Fund of the Lutheran Free Church, I beg to advise that the Insurance Department objects to that portion of Article 9 which relates to the payment of a pension or annuity to members of the association who have resigned on account of sickness or disability. If this feature is eliminated so that the articles will authorize the corporation to pay a pension fund of an indefinite amount, according to the fund that may accumulate from donations and payments by members, the corporation will be a benevolent corporation and authorized to file its articles as such.
