WHEREAS, as a result of the late conflict in which Finland was engaged,  
many aged people, women and children are suffering misery and despair from pri-  
vation and hunger, and,

WHEREAS, we bear no ill will toward the unfortunate people throughout  
the world whose countries are engaged in war and least of all against the old  
people, women and children, and,

WHEREAS, many people of Minnesota, though not all, are able to do some-  
thing to relieve the suffering of these people,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Harold E. Stassen, Governor of the State of Minnesota,  
do hereby designate and proclaim

SUNDAY, JUNE 23, 1941

as

FINLAND DAY

and I strongly urge that the people of the State through the local newspapers give  
generously according to their means to the needy people of Finland.

State of Minnesota to be affixed at the
