

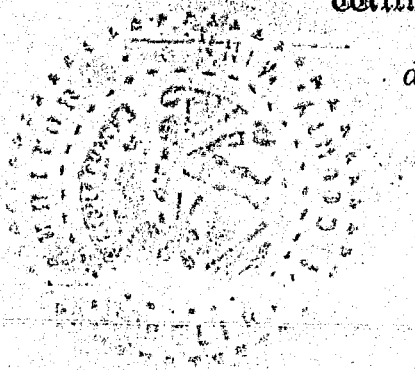

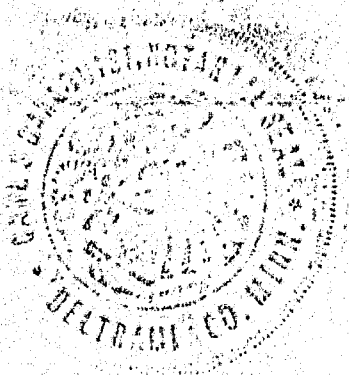

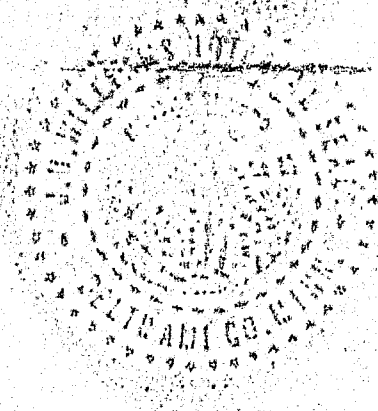

And, WHEREAS, said petition was duly verified by three of the signers thereof, to the effect that all of the matters and things set forth in said petition are true, and that the census mentioned and referred to in said petition was actually taken at the time as in said petition set forth, and it appearing to the Board, upon the hearing of said petition, that the territory, and the whole thereof, therein described, is so conditioned as properly to be subjected to village government; and that all of the matters and things set forth in said petition are true:

NOW THEREFORE, it is hereby ordered by the Board of County Commissioners of Beltrami County, State of Minnesota, and notice is hereby given, that on Tuesday, the 11th day of Dec., 1906, between the hours of nine o'clock in the morning and five o'clock in the evening of said day, at the building known as the Rogers building, (situate on lot 1, in block 2, of the original township of Baudette, according to the map thereof, now on file and on record, in the office of the Register of Deeds, in and for said county and state, the said building being at the corner of Fourth street of Henderson Avenue, and within the limits of the said proposed village) an election shall be held, wherein the electors of said proposed village will vote, for or against the proposition for the incorporation of the Village of Baudette.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that William Rogers, C. S. Dahlquist and I. R. Severtson, residents of said proposed village, be, and they are, hereby appointed inspectors at said election.

AND IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that said petition, together with the resolution thereon, and a copy of this resolution and notice, shall be printed in the Rainy River Region, a weekly newspaper, published within the said proposed village, for two successive weeks previous to the date fixed for the holding of said election, and that said petition together with the verifications thereon, and a copy of this resolution and notice, shall be posted in three public places within the boundaries described of the said proposed village, which said notice shall be posted not less than twenty, nor more than thirty days prior to the date herein fixed for the holding of said election.
