
ORDER EXTENDING PROTECTION TO MINNOWS IN CENTERVILLE LAKE, AND
PELTIER LAKE, ANOKA COUNTY.

Whereas, it has been represented to the Game and
Fish Commissioner that minnows are in danger of undue depletion
in the waters of Centerville and Peltier Lakes in Anoka County,
State of Minnesota, and

Whereas, the Game and Fish Commissioner has
investigated and has presented me with the results of his
investigation, and has recommended that additional protection
be given minnows in the above named lakes to prevent their
undue depletion,

Now, therefore, I, Theodore Christianson, Governor
of the State of Minnesota, by virtue of and pursuant to authority
vested in me by Section 134, Chapter 400, S.L. Minnesota, 1919,
Sec. 5640 G.S. 1923, do hereby order that no minnows be taken
from the waters of Centerville and Peltier Lakes and all inflowing
and outflowing waters connected therewith, located within the
boundaries of Township 31 N., R. 22 W., Anoka County, be and
the same are hereby closed to the taking of all minnows from
such waters during the seasons of 1929 and 1930.

This order shall remain in force until the close
of the 1931 regular session of the Legislature of the State of
Minnesota unless sooner revoked or modified.
