WRIT AND PROCLAMATION OF SPECIAL PRIMARY AND
SPECIAL ELECTION TO FILL THE VACANCY IN THE
OFFICE OF REPRESENTATIVE IN CONGRESS FROM
THE FIFTH CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT OF THE
STATE OF MINNESOTA.

To the People of the State of Minnesota and particularly
of the Fifth Congressional District of said State,
to the Secretary of State of the State of Minnesota,
to the County Auditor of the County of Hennepin in
said State, to all Election Officials of said Fifth
Congressional District and of the several Election
Districts therein, and to all Others Whom it May
Concern,

GREETING:


WHEREAS the Honorable Walter H. Newton, Repre-
sentative in Congress from the Fifth Congressional District
of Minnesota, has tendered his resignation from said office
to take effect June 30, 1929, which said resignation has
been accepted by me; and

WHEREAS the Congress is now in session, and the
person elected to said office will have occasion to exer-
cise the functions thereof on and after July 1, 1929;


NOW THEREFORE, I, Theodore Christianson, as
Governor of the State of Minnesota, acting under the
authority and direction of section 2 of article 1 of the
Constitution of the United States and the statutes in such
cases provided, do hereby direct that a Special Primary
Election be held in said Fifth Congressional District on
Monday, the tenth day of June, 1929, and that a Special
Election be held in said district on Monday, the seven-
teenth day of June, 1929, to fill the vacancy which will

exist in said office; notice of said primary and election to be given, candidates to be nominated, and such primary and election to be held, and all things pertaining thereto to be done, as provided by Laws 1929, chapter 297; and other applicable provisions of law.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto caused the Great Seal of the State to be affixed, and have hereunto set my hand, at the Capitol in the City of St. Paul, Minnesota, this twenty-third day of May, 1929.
