That the publisher of said newspaper on Jan. 28, 1901, filed with the county auditor of said Cass county an affidavit setting forth the facts required by section 2 of chapter 23 of the Laws of the State of Minnesota for the year 1893, and amendments thereto as provided by chapter 256, Laws of 1897.

Ordinance Number 56.

An Ordinance annexing certain unplatted and abutting lands to the village of Cass Lake and extending the boundaries of said village so as to include the same.

The Village Council of the Village of Cass Lake do ordain as follows:

Section 1. That the following described unplatted lands, namely: The southeast quarter of the southeast quarter (sec 14) section nine (9) of township one hundred forty-five (145) north of range thirty-one (31) west of the fifth principal meridian, abutting upon the incorporated village of Cass Lake, Minnesota, be and the same is hereby annexed to such village, and the village boundaries of said village are hereby extended so as to include and make said lands a part of said village as actually as if it had been originally a part thereof.

Section 2. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately after its passage, approval, publication and the filing of a certified copy thereof with the Secretary of State.

— Section 2. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately after its passage, approval, publication and filing of a certified copy thereof with the Secretary of State. —
