PROCLAMATION

September 17, 1929.


WHEREAS, October 11, 1929, marks the one hundred and fiftieth anniversary of the death of General Casimir Pulaski, heroic martyr in the struggle for American liberty, and

WHEREAS, this illustrious son of Poland rendered valiant and highly important service to the cause of American independence during the Revolutionary War, as Brigadier General of the Continental Army and as commander of an independent corps known as Pulaski's Legion, and

WHEREAS, General Pulaski died on October 11, 1779, of wounds received on October 9, 1779, at the siege of Savannah, Georgia, while fighting for American freedom,


THEREFORE, I, Theodore Christianson, Governor of Minnesota, in pursuance of the provisions of Resolution No.12 adopted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota during its 1929 session, do hereby urge the people of Minnesota to observe Friday, October 11, 1929, as "Pulaski Memorial Day" with appropriate ceremonies in schools and such other places as may be deemed appropriate, in commemoration of his death; and I do also call upon public officials and the people generally, to display the flag of the United States on that day.
