
I, Mike Holm, Secretary of State, as required by Laws 1929, Chapter 297, opened and canvassed, on October 21, 1929, the certified copies of the Statements made by the County Canvassing Boards of the votes cast at the Special Election held on October 16th, 1929, in the several counties of the State constituting the Seventh Congressional District, to fill the vacancy in the office of Representative in Congress for said District for the term expiring March 4th, 1931, and I prepared therefrom a statement of the whole number of votes cast at said Special Election for candidates for Representative in Congress from the said Seventh Congressional District, and have specified the names of the persons receiving such votes and the number received by each, specifying the several Counties in which they were cast, which said statement is as follows:--

Paul John Kvale received Twenty-four Thousand Seven Hundred

And the said Paul John Kvale having received the highest number of votes for the office of Representative in Congress, Seventh Congressional District in the State of Minnesota to fill the vacancy in the office of Representative in Congress for said District for the term expiring March 4th, 1931, is hereby duly declared elected to that office.
