PROCLAMATION

In times of peace, no less than in times of war, we should pause and reflect on what our flag means to us. At all times it is a pledge of protection and security at home and abroad. That the youth may be taught, and all citizens reminded of the privileges which it guarantees, it is well that one day each year should be set aside for the general display of the flag in remembrance of the principles for which our flag stands.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Theodore Christianson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby designate



FLAG DAY.

I urge that the flag of our country be displayed from public buildings, places of business, on the streets of our cities and villages, and from our homes; that where school is in session, appropriate exercises be held, and that instruction be given not only in the proper use of our national emblem and in the manner of honoring it, but in the principles of government which it symbolizes, that the people in our respective communities dedicate themselves anew to the ideals and institutions for which it stands.
