BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Secretary of the Board of Education of Independent School District No. 9 be, and he hereby is, authorized and instructed to furnish a certified copy of this resolution to the Secretary of the State of Minnesota together with a request that said Secretary of State cause the census desired herein to be taken.

My dear Sir:-

I am this day in receipt of an opinion from the Attorney General as per my letter of June 11, copy of which I am inclosing herewith which is self-explanatory.

In line with the suggestion therein contained, I am going to ask you to have the school board pass another resolution, simply asking for the taking of the census of Independent School District No. 9, and not mentioning the villages of Washburn and Keosauqua as in the former resolution. I would also like to have embodied in this resolution the fact that all expenses in connection with the taking of this census are to be guaranteed and paid by the school board. This, of course, is in conformity with the law but I feel it would be better to have it embodied in the resolution.

As soon as possible after the receipt by me of the resolution above referred to, and before any appointment is made, either of supervisor or enumerators, I shall pay a visit to your village and consult with yourself and the members of the school board, as I feel that this is a matter of sufficient importance to warrant a visit of this kind. Under the law, I am required to certify to the result and I would very much like to know more of the qualifications of those who are going to act as my representatives. The travelling expenses in connection with this trip of course must be borne by the district.
