
To the framers of this Constitution belongs the respect and homage of the people of our country who today are enjoying the benefits of their great work.

C O N S T I T U T I O N D A Y.


Let youth be taught in the schools respect for the Constitution and all laws and let the patriotic citizens dedicate themselves anew to the high ideals for which our Constitution stands.
