PROCLAMATION

September 17, 1930, marks the one-hundred and forty-third anniversary of the adoption of the American Constitution. The intervening years have been years of progress and unprecedented growth. No other nation has in so brief a period advanced to such heights of power and prosperity. The record here made has proved the soundness of our Constitution. Truly it has served well as the foundation for the most stable and efficient government in the world.

To the framers of the fundamental law belong the respect and homage of the nation, which today is enjoying the benefits of their great work.

NOW, THEREFORE, to commemorate the anniversary of the adoption of the Constitution of the United States, to renew the people's gratitude to the fathers and their loyalty to their country, I, Theodore Christianson, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim and designate Wednesday, September 17, 1930, as

CONSTITUTION DAY.

Let youth be taught in the schools to respect the Constitution and all laws enacted pursuant to it, and let patriotic citizens everywhere fe-dedicate themselves to the high ideals which gave our nation birth.


