Governor's Order No. 7, Extending Additional Protection to Chinese Ringneck or English Pheasants in the State of Minnesota.

WHEREAS, it has been represented to the Commissioner of Game and Fish that the Chinese Ringneck or English Pheasants are in danger of undue depletion in the State of Minnesota, and

WHEREAS, the Commissioner of Game and Fish has investigated, and has recommended that additional protection be given to the Chinese Ringneck or English Pheasants in Minnesota, to prevent their undue depletion,


Now, Therefore, I, Theodore Christianson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, by virtue of and pursuant to authority in me vested, by Section 5640, G. S. 1923, do hereby order:

First: That no Chinese Ringneck or English Pheasants be taken during the season of 1930 in Wabasha County nor in that section of the State lying north or east of a boundary line drawn along the northern boundaries of the Counties of Washington, Anoka, Wright, Meeker, Kandiyohi, Pope and Grant and the south boundary line of Wilkins County.

Second: That no Chinese Ringneck or English Pheasants be taken during the season of 1930 in the following Counties, previous to October 15th, 1930, and after October 19th, 1930, both dates inclusive: Anoka, Washington, Dakota, Goodhue, Olmsted, Winona, Fillmore and Houston Counties.

~~Third: That no Chinese Ringneck or English Pheasants be taken during the season of 1930 in the following Counties, previous to October 15th, 1930, and after October 26th, 1930, both dates inclusive: Rock, Nobles, Jackson, Martin, Faribault, Freeborn, Mower, Dodge, Steele, Waseca, Blue Earth, Watonwan, Cottonwood, Murray, Pipestone, Lincoln, Lyon, Redwood, Brown, Nicollet, LeSueur, Rice, Scott, Sibley, Renville, Yellow Medicine, Lac Qui Parle, Chippewa, Kandiyohi, Meeker, McLeod, Carver, Hennepin, Wright, Swift, Bigstone, Traverse, Stevens, Pope and Grant.~~

This order shall remain in force until the close of the 1931 regular session of the Legislature of the State of Minnesota, unless sooner revoked or modified.
