



Benson, Attorney General of the State of Minnesota, by virtue of the authority vested in me by statute, and particularly by authority of section 110, General Statutes of Minnesota 1923, do hereby constitute and appoint JOHN F. BONNER of Minneapolis, Minnesota, to be an Assistant Attorney General of the state of Minnesota, for the period commencing January 5, 1931, and continuing until this commission shall be revoked or otherwise terminated in accordance with the law.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand at St. Paul, Minnesota, this fifth day of January, 1931.


