There is an unsurveyed island of approximately three fourths of an acre area, situated in the north half of the north west one fourth of Sec. 22-59-24 West of the Fourth Principal Meridian, lying in Long Lake in the County of Itasca.

I have tried to locate through existing records the ownership of this island both in the State Auditors office in Hibbing and the Court House records in Grand Rapids. No record of the ownership, or the island exists in these offices.

I wish to apply for a Federal Survey and this letter is to conform to the Government regulations that I must notify you of this intent to have this survey made. I would appreciate an acknowledgement of this so as to submit it with my application for the survey to the Land Commissioner at Washington.
