

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE DRAINAGE OF THE CITIES OF MINNEAPOLIS AND ST. PAUL;

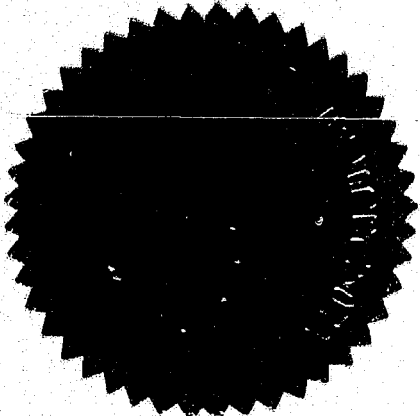
That, it appears that the cities of the first class, to-wit: The City of Minneapolis in Hennepin County, and the City of St. Paul in Ramsey County are disposing of their sewage into the Mississippi River, a natural water course which flows through such cities;

And, therefore, I, Theodore Tilton, Governor of the State of Minnesota, having appointed Clarence W. Rogers of Winona County, who was by me selected, Charles V. Boyce and Marshall H. Bennett, who were selected by the City Council and the Mayor, respectively, of the City of Minneapolis, George W. Shepard and Oscar Johnson, who were selected by the City Council and Mayor, respectively, of the City of St. Paul, as the members of a Metropolitan Drainage Commission, do hereby order and declare that the City of Minneapolis and the City of St. Paul shall be included within the jurisdiction of such drainage commission, and I fix the 27th day of June, 1887, at ten o'clock A.M. between 101 in the Capitol in St. Paul as the time and place of the first meeting of the Commission.

This order is made under and by virtue of the power in me vested by Chapter 101 of the Laws of 1887.

Given under my hand and the great seal of the State at the Capitol in the City of St. Paul this 23rd day of June, A.D., 1887.
