

Upon the written request of Mike Holm, secretary of state, and pursuant to the provisions of Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, section 114, I hereby appoint

HERBERT P. KELLER

of St. Paul, Minnesota, as special attorney for the secretary of state to institute and conduct in his behalf any action in the district or supreme court of this state which may be necessary to determine the controversy which has arisen relative to the constitutionality of Laws 1931, chapter 306, section 7, by which the legislature has attempted to appropriate money to the secretary of state for the expenses of the motor vehicle division in his office out of the moneys collected in said division as motor vehicle registration taxes. In my judgment the public welfare will be promoted by such appointment.

The compensation of the said Herbert P. Keller for such services shall not exceed the following amounts:


\$25 per day for preparatory work and briefing;

\$50 per day for necessary hearings in district court;

\$100 for argument in supreme court.

The bill for such services is to be subject to the approval of the secretary of state and the attorney general.
