GOVERNOR'S ORDER NO. 13 of 1931


ORDER PROVIDING ADDITIONAL PROTECTION FOR QUAIL IN MINNESOTA:

Whereas, the Director of Game and Fish of the Minnesota Department of Conservation has investigated the necessity of providing additional protection for quail and has found that this species is in danger of undue depletion,


Therefore, I, Floyd B. Olson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, pursuant to authority vested in me by Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, Section 5640, do hereby order that no quail be taken or killed in the State of Minnesota during the year 1931 except in Houston, Winona, Wabasha, Olmsted, Carver, Sibley, Scott, Le Sueur, Sherburne, Nicollet, Dakota and Washington Counties, in which counties said species may be taken for a period of twenty days only, from November 1st to November 30th, both dates inclusive, each day from sunrise to sunset.

This order supercedes Governor's Order No. 12, dated October 3rd, 1931, and shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication and shall remain in effect and be in force until revoked or modified.
