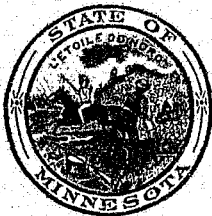
You ask if the records of this department show that this amount has been paid in since November 4th by Mr. McDermott.
