I beg to advise you that two islands in a meandered lake in the S $\frac{1}{2}$ Sec. 9, T. 141 N., R. 39 W., 5th Prin. Mer., within the White Earth Indian Reservation, Minnesota, have recently been surveyed as public land subject to appropriate disposal, by a field surveying party operating under my supervision. The survey was made upon application of the Commissioner of Indian Affairs.

This notice is served in order that you may be advised of the proceedings and have an opportunity of filing with the Commissioner, General Land Office, Washington, D. C., a statement of any interest which the State of Minnesota may have in said islands. Such statement should be filed within 30 days.
