That they are voters residing within the following described terri-

tory which it is proposed to incorporate as a village.

That your petitioners respectfully request that your body appoint a time and place when and where the electors actually residing within said territory may vote for or against incorporation as a village.

That the boundaries of said proposed village are as follows:
