PROCLAMATION

General Casimir Pulaski, the American hero of the Revolutionary War, died on October 11, 1779, of wounds received on October 9, 1779, at the siege of Savannah, Georgia, while fighting for American freedom.

October 11th of each year has been designated by Congress and by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota as "General Pulaski's Memorial Day".

It is most fitting that recognition should be given to the memory of this illustrious son of Poland, who rendered such valuable assistance to the cause of American freedom, and it is especially fitting that this observance should be held this year, the two hundredth anniversary of the birth of George Washington, who was General Pulaski's Commander.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Floyd B. Olson, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby designate



PULASKI MEMORIAL DAY.


