GOVERNOR'S ORDER NO. 3 of 1932.


ORDER PROVIDING ADDITIONAL PROTECTION FOR QUAIL IN MINNESOTA:

Whereas, the Director of Game and Fish of the Minnesota Department of Conservation has investigated the necessity of providing additional protection for quail and has found that this species is in danger of undue depletion,


Therefore, I, Floyd B. Olson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, pursuant to authority vested in me by Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, Section 8340, do hereby order that no quail be taken or killed in the State of Minnesota during the year 1932 except in Houston, Fillmore, Winona, Olmsted, Wabasha, Goodhue, Dakota, Scott and Rice Counties, in which Counties said species may be taken for a period of twenty-two days only, from October 30th to November 20th, both dates inclusive, each day from sunrise to sunset.

It is further prescribed that the number of such quail which may be taken shall not exceed ten birds in any one day and shall not exceed ten birds in possession at any one time.
