MINUTES OF SPECIAL ELECTION

(a) The lines following the letter (a) in this blank are left to write in the fact, that "the electors present at the time and place named for opening the polls, elected the judges and clerk *vide voce*, because the Council had neglected to make such appointment," or "because the persons so appointed, or one or more of them, neglected or refused to serve" (if such was the case).

At the Special Election of the Village of Plainview in the County of Wabasha and State of Minnesota, held at Village Hall being the place where it was directed to be held by the Village Council after giving due notice thereof as provided by law; on the 9th day of June 1908, and W. R. Damsode, A. A. Marshall, J. G. Bolton two qualified voters of said Village, to act as Judges of such Election, and one qualified voter of said Village to act as Clerk of such Election, each of whom had within twenty days before such time been designated and appointed by the Village Council to act as Judges and Clerk respectively of such Election, (a)

who, being present, at the hour of 10 o'clock A. M., each of them duly took and subscribed an oath to faithfully discharge the duties required of them at such election, and the said Judges and Clerk being duly qualified, forthwith opened the polls by proclamation, and the election proceeded by ballot without adjournment or intermission until closed.

The subjects voted on at such Election, as stated in the Notice thereof, were:

To-wit: Whether such Village of Plainview will continue to exist under the Special Act of the Legislature and amendments thereto, incorporating the same, or will become reincorporated under the Revised Laws, 1905.

At 4 o'clock in the afternoon of said day the polls were closed, proclamation thereof having been made by one of the Judges thirty minutes previous thereto. The Judges and Clerk then proceeded forthwith to publicly count the votes cast, and the result thereof was duly proclaimed to the voters by said Judges and Clerk, who recorded the same in the Village Minute Book.

The Following Resolution was adopted by Village Council, of The Village of Plainview, ~~Plain~~ Minnesota. May 4th. 1908.

Resolved, To submit at a special Village election, the question whether such Village of Plainview, will continue to exist under the special Act of the Legislature, and the amendments thereto, incorporating the same, or will become reincorporated under the revised Laws, of 1905.

Such Special election to be held on Tuesday the 9th. of June 1908., from 9 o'clock in the forenoon, A. M. until 4 o'clock in the afternoon of said day, be voted by ballot, and the ballots to read for re incorporation Yes or No as provided by Law. and the result canvassed as provided for as at an annual Election.

If a majority vote for reincorporation, the trustees will certify and return the result thereof to The County Auditor and The Secy. of State and there upon the Special act of incorporation shall be deemed surrendered and the Village of Plainview, shall become incorporated under the revised laws of ~~1908~~ 1905. May 4th. 1908.

**AFFIDAVIT OF PUBLICATION.**

personally came before me, and being duly sworn deposes and says, that he now is, and during all the time hereinafter mentioned has been the Publisher and printer of The Plainview News, a weekly newspaper printed and published at Plainview, in said Wabasha County, on Friday of each week. That he knows of his own knowledge that the printed notice of Special Village Election hereto attached, cut from the columns of said newspaper, was inserted, printed and published in said newspaper once in each week for two successive weeks, and that all of said publications were made in the English language. That said notice was first inserted, printed and published in said newspaper on Friday, the 27th day of May 1908.

That during all the time aforesaid said newspaper was a collection of general and local news comments and miscellaneous literary items, and regularly issued and published on Friday of each week from a known office of publication said office being equipped with the necessary materials and skilled workmen for producing the same, and has consisted of not less than four pages, of more than five columns to the page, each column not less than seventeen and three-fourths inches in length and never made up wholly of patents, plates and advertisements, or either or any of them and has not been substantially a duplicate of any other newspaper, and has been regularly delivered each week to more than two hundred and fifty paid subscribers, and that said newspaper, composed and consisting as above set forth, was printed and published in the English language weekly, and generally circulated in Wabasha County for more than one year next preceeding the date of the first publication of said notice.
