Satisfactory evidence having been exhibited to me

that Daniel J. McGrath

has been appointed Consul of the Irish Free State

at Chicago, Illinois,

I do hereby recognize him as such, and declare him free to exercise and enjoy such functions, powers and privileges as are allowed to Consuls by the law of Nations, or by the laws of the United States and existing treaty stipulations between His Britannic Majesty and the Government of the United States.

In testimony whereof, I have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the United States to be hereunto affixed.

DONE AT THE CITY OF WASHINGTON THIS second day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, and of the Independence of the United States of America, the one hundred and fifty-seventh.
