

ORDINANCE NUMBER 55.

An Ordinance annexing certain unplatteed and abutting lands to the Village of Cass Lake, and extending the boundaries of said village as to include the same.

The Village Council of the Village of Cass Lake, Minnesota, do ordain as follows:-

Section 1. That the following described unplatteed lands, namely Lot number two (2) and the east half of Lot number Three (3) of section fifteen (15) in township one hundred forty five (145) North, or Range thirty one (31) West of the fifth Principal Meridian, in the County of Cass, State of Minnesota, containing fifty one 25/100 (51.25) acres, abutting upon the incorporated Village of Cass Lake, Minnesota, be and the same is hereby annexed to such village, and the village boundaries of said village are hereby extended so as to include and make said lands a part of said Village as effectually as if it had been originally a part thereof.

Section 2. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately after its passage, approval, publication and the filing of a certified copy thereof with the Secretary of State.
