The following is a copy of the Charter Amendment to the Charter of the City of Columbia Heights, County of Anoka, State of Minnesota, as adopted by the City Council on the 17th day of April, 1933, and as ratified and adopted by the people of the City of Columbia Heights on the 15th day of May, 1933.

Highway Progress
The City of Columbia Heights is hereby authorized to acquire, construct, maintain and operate a highway system within the City of Columbia Heights, and to levy a tax on the property within the City of Columbia Heights for the purpose of financing such highway system.

Apparatus for receiving vessels in-charge
The City of Columbia Heights is hereby authorized to acquire, construct, maintain and operate an apparatus for receiving vessels in-charge, and to levy a tax on the property within the City of Columbia Heights for the purpose of financing such apparatus.

Receipt of Ship's SOS
The City of Columbia Heights is hereby authorized to acquire, construct, maintain and operate a receipt of ship's SOS, and to levy a tax on the property within the City of Columbia Heights for the purpose of financing such receipt.

New Apparatus for receiving vessels in-charge
The City of Columbia Heights is hereby authorized to acquire, construct, maintain and operate a new apparatus for receiving vessels in-charge, and to levy a tax on the property within the City of Columbia Heights for the purpose of financing such apparatus.

Slaves mostly are seized in inter-tribal fights
The City of Columbia Heights is hereby authorized to acquire, construct, maintain and operate a system for receiving slaves, and to levy a tax on the property within the City of Columbia Heights for the purpose of financing such system.

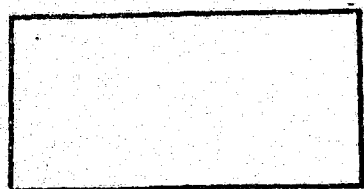

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE
CHARTER OF THE CITY OF
COLUMBIA HEIGHTS,
MINNESOTA.
The Charter of the City of Columbia Heights, adopted June 9th, 1921, is hereby amended and the amendments shall be added to the Charter of the City of Columbia Heights, Minnesota, a new section to be numbered Section 22A to read as follows and Sections 21 and 22 of said Charter are hereby amended to be re-sectioned as follows:
Section 22A. Primary Election. A primary election shall be held on the first day before the regular municipal election in the year 1922 and biennially thereafter at the same place or places as regular elections are held and the officials shall preside at such elections. The purpose of such primary election shall be to select candidates for the office of the general municipal election and the candidates for nomination to each office who shall receive the greatest number of votes in such primary election shall be placed upon the ballot of the next general election in numbers not to exceed the number of vacancies to be filled and no other name shall be placed upon the ballot for such general election than the candidates selected at said primary election. Any person desiring to become a candidate for an elective office in the general municipal election shall file with the City Clerk at least ten days prior to said primary election a statement of such candidacy as follows:
I, _____, being first duly sworn, say that I reside at _____ Street in the City of Columbia Heights, County of Anoka, State of Minnesota; That I am a qualified voter therein; That I am a candidate for nomination to the office of _____ to be voted upon at the primary election on _____ the _____ day of _____, 19____; and I hereby request that my name be printed upon the official primary ballot for the nomination by such primary election for said office.

and shall pay to the City Clerk the sum of Five Dollars for which the City Clerk shall give to him a receipt expressing the purpose of the payment. Such City Clerk shall forthwith pay all fees so received by him to the City Treasurer. Upon compliance with the provisions of this section the City Clerk shall place such names upon the primary election ballot as a candidate for the office named. At least fifteen days notice shall be given by the City Clerk of the time and place of holding such primary election and of the officers to be nominated, by posting a notice thereof in at least three of the most public places in each election district in the city or by publication of a notice thereof at least once in the official newspaper or both, as the City Council may ordain, but failure to give such notice shall not invalidate such election.
Section 31, Chapter 4 of the Charter of the City of Columbia Heights, Minnesota adopted June 9th, 1921, which reads as follows:
Section 31. Nominations by Petition. The mode of nomination of all elective officers provided for by this charter shall be by petition. The name of any elector of the city shall be printed upon the ballot whenever a petition as hereinafter prescribed shall have been filed in his behalf with the city clerk. Such petition shall be signed by a number of electors equivalent to at least five per cent of the total number of votes cast at the last regular municipal election. No

THE CITY OF COLUMBIA HEIGHTS, MINN. HEREBY RESOLVES TO
APPROVE AND ADD TO THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF COLUMBIA HEIGHTS,
COUNTY OF ANOKA, MINNESOTA, AS FOLLOWS:

no person shall sign petitions for more candidates than the number of places to be filled at the election, and should he do so his signature shall be void as to the petition or petitions last filed. All nomination petitions shall be in the hands of the city clerk at least 10 days before the election. The Clerk shall prepare the ballots in a manner to be provided by ordinance.

Section 32. Charter 4 of the Charter of the City of Columbia Heights, Minnesota, adopted June 10th, 1921, which reads as follows:

Section 32. Nomination Petitions. The signatures to the nomination petition need not all be on one paper, but to each separate paper there shall be attached an affidavit of the director thereof stating the number of copies of such paper and that each signature appended thereto was made in the presence and is the genuine signature of the person whose name it purports to be. With each signature shall be stated the name of residence of the signer, giving the street number or other description sufficient to identify the same. The form of the nomination petition shall be substantially as follows:

Not a valid petition
We, the undersigned electors of the City of Columbia Heights hereby nominate () whose residence is in () for the office of councilman to be voted for at the election to be held on the day of 1922, and we individually certify that we are qualified electors and that we have not signed more nomination petitions of candidates for this office than there are persons to be elected thereto.
