PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO CITY CHARTER.

To the Honorable Mayor and City Council of the City of Montevideo, Minnesota.

The Charter Commissioners of said City do hereby propose the following amendments to the Charter of said City, heretofore submitted by them and under which said City now exists:

First.

Add to Chapter Two (2) a new Section to be numbered Eleven (11)

to read as follows:
"The regular City Election shall be held annually on the Third Tuesday in January of each year."

Second. After Section Six(6) Chapter Tight (8) insert the following:
"The issued of any bonds of the City, whereby its aggregate indebtedness would be made to exceed Ten per cent of the last assessed valuation of the taxable property therein, is prohibited."

Insert in Section Seven (7) Chapter Three (3) after the word City where it occurs the second time in said Section, the following: " and pay out the same upon the order of the Clerk, counter-signed by the President of the Council." Fourth.

Strike out the word "any" in line One (1) of Section Five (5) Chapter Tleven (11) and insert in lieu thereof the word "The", and strike out the words "Village or borrough" where they occur in line Two(2) of said Section. Strike out the words "or other governing body" where they occur in line Tix (6) of said Section, and strike out the word "its" where it occurs in line Six (6) of said Section and insert in lieu thereof the word "the".

Add Section Fifteen (15) to Chapter Three (3) to read as fol-

lows:

"The City Clerk shall give a bond to be approved by the Council, in the sum of not less than Two Thousand Dollars (\$2000.00) and the Treasurer shall give a bond to be approved by the Council, in such an amount as may be fixed by the Council, but not less than the largest amount likely to be in his hands at any one time.
