GOVERNOR'S ORDER NO. 4 FOR 1933.

ORDER PROVIDING ADDITIONAL PROTECTION FOR DEER IN MINNESOTA:

Whereas, the Director of Game and Fish of the Minnesota Department of Conservation has investigated the necessity of providing additional protection for deer and

Whereas, it is found that there is an abundance of deer in Minnesota at this time, and


Whereas, it appears that the opening of a five day season on deer for 1933 would strengthen rather than weaken the herd, and

Whereas, there is danger of deer becoming so numerous that disease may materially lessen their numbers, and


Whereas, owing to the depression, there is need of food by people in destitute circumstances;

Therefore, I, Floyd B. Olson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, pursuant to authority vested in me by Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, Section 5640, do hereby order that an open season of five (5) days be declared on deer in the State of Minnesota, during 1933, from November 21st at sunrise to November 25th at sunset, in the counties of Cook, Lake, St. Louis, Koochiching, Itasca, Beltrami, Lake of the Woods, Pine and Carlton. One deer of either sex may be taken on each license.
