PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, Legislation to enable the state of Minnesota and the political subdivisions thereof to more fully cope with destitution and unemployment, and to more fully cooperate with the federal government in its endeavors to relieve destitution and unemployment, is necessary at this time, and

WHEREAS, The Eighteenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States, prohibiting the manufacture, transportation and sale of intoxicating liquor, has been repealed by the ratification by the states of the Twenty-First Amendment to the Constitution of the United States, and


WHEREAS, It is essential in the interests of law and order in the state of Minnesota that legislation be immediately enacted to regulate the manufacture, transportation and sale of intoxicating liquor in this state,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Floyd B. Olson, Governor of the state of Minnesota do hereby summon the members of the Legislature to convene in extra session on


TUESDAY, December 5, 1933.

And I respectfully request that the Legislature at this special session confine its activities to the consideration of legislation affecting the emergency subject-matter hereinbefore referred to.
