
GOVERNOR'S ORDER NO. 8 FOR 1934

ORDER PROVIDING ADDITIONAL PROTECTION FOR CHINESE RINGNECK OR
ENGLISH PHEASANTS:


Whereas, the Director of the Division of Game and Fish of the Minnesota Department of Conservation has investigated the necessity of providing additional protection for female Chinese Ringneck or English Pheasants and has found that this species is in danger of undue depletion,

Therefore, I, Floyd B. Olson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, pursuant to authority vested in me by Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, Section 5640, do hereby order that no female Chinese Ringneck or English Pheasants be taken or killed in the State of Minnesota during the year 1934.
