

PETITION FOR THE ELECTION
FOR
PROPOSED INCORPORATION OF VILLAGE OF INVER GROVE.

TO THE HONORABLE, THE COUNTY BOARD OF DAKOTA COUNTY:

Gentlemen:

We the undersigned, consisting of more than twenty-five (25) legal voters residing within the territory hereinafter described, which territory consists of parts of sections not in any incorporated village and in the County of Dakota, State of Minnesota, which has been platted into lots and blocks, with a view to village occupancy, which plats have been duly and legally surveyed according to the laws of the State of Minnesota and filed in the office of the Register of Deeds, for the said County of Dakota, in which said lands lie, and also the lands which adjoin said platted property in said County, hereinafter described all of which said platted and unplatted lands contain a resident population of more than two hundred (200), and which ^{unplatted} property of said territory adjoins the platted portion thereof and is so conditioned as properly to be subject to village government; respectfully petitions and shows to your honorable body as follows:

First: That between the 12th day of June, 1909, and the 14th day of June, 1909, we have caused to be taken a census of the resident population within the territory hereinafter described. That the number of actual residents thereof and the names thereof are and said census is as follows:

The boundaries of the territory proposed to be incorporated in said village are as follows:

Beginning at the south east corner of the north one half ($1/2$) of the north east one quarter ($1/4$), of Section ten (10), Township twenty-seven (27), of Range twenty-two (22) west of the fourth (4th) principal Meridian, thence north on the east line of said Section Ten (10), to the south line of Haaker Avenue; thence west to the west Woodland line of ^{Woodland} Night's Addition; thence north on the west line of ^{Woodland} Night's Addition to the south line of Gladstone Avenue; thence west on the south line of Gladstone Avenue to the west line of Inver Grove Park Addition; thence north along the west line of Inver Grove Park Addition and Inver Grove Factory Addition to the south boundary line of the city of South St. Paul, known as Linden Street; thence east on the south boundary line of the city of South St. Paul to the west bank of the Mississippi River, thence northerly along the east line of South St. Paul to a point opposite the north line of Government Lot Seven (7).

thence east to the current of the Mississippi River; south along the current of the Mississippi River to the South line of Government Lot N Nine (9), Section eleven (11), thence north on west line of Government Lot Nine (9) to a point due east of the South east corner of the north one half (1/2) of the North east quarter (1/4) of Section Ten (10), Township twenty-seven (127) of Range Twenty-two (22) west; thence west to the place of beginning.

That said proposed territory contains the plats of Cleveland Woodland Park, Hight's Addition, Inver Grove Park Addition, and Inver Grove Factory Addition. That said territory has been partly platted into lots with a view to village occupancy and contains Two Hundred Eleven (211), number of residents. That the proposed name of said village is the village of Inver Grove. That the quantity of land embraced therein is about Five Hundred and Ninety (590) acres.

WHEREFORE we respectfully petition your honorable body that it order and call an election for the determination of said proposed incorporation. Said election to be held with in the limits of the territory proposed to be incorporated. That your honorable body cause notices thereof to be made, given and posted and said election to be held in all respects in manner and form as required by law for the incorporation of villages pursuant to chapter 9 of Revised Laws of 1905, and acts amendatory thereof.


